

DO/DON'T

discard in the Plastic, Metal and Drink-carton (PMD) bin

Plastic



- Bottles for detergent, shampoo, cleaning products and soap
- Empty blister packs of chewing gum or medication
- Plastic yoghurt, whipped cream, quark, custard and ice cream cups
- Plastic containers/packaging for fruit, salad, fish, cheese or meat (no polystyrene)
- Bags for pasta, rice, bread, sweets, crisps, etc.
- Tubs for butter, sauce and cream cheese
- Plastic bottles for soft drinks and water (please note: large and small plastic bottles have a deposit. Don't throw them away; return them.)
- Plastic (squeeze) bottles for oil, vinegar, sauces, etc.
- Plastic carrier bags and small bags
- Magazine and leaflet wrapping film
- Tubes for gel, body lotion, toothpaste, etc.
- Plastic jars for gel and vitamins
- Plastic packaging from items such as toothbrushes and screws
- Disposable cups (plastic)
- Plastic plant pots
- Plastic used to wrap vegetables, bread, toilet rolls, tea boxes, cigarettes, flowers, etc. (also: cellophane)
- Empty packaging of chemical products, such as an empty turpentine bottle or empty drain cleaner bottle

Metal and tin



- Metal lids and caps
- Coffee pods
- Empty paint tins
- Spray cans (empty)
- Tealight cups
- Steel syrup bottles
- Empty drink cans, such as beer, soft drinks and chocolate milk (check for a deposit. In that case, don't throw them away, but return them.)
- Empty tins (soup, vegetables, frankfurters, fish, cat food)
- Aluminium food cans and foil
- Plastic with a metal or aluminium lining (coffee bags, chewing gum wrappers)

Drink cartons



- Cartons for fruit juice, milk, pasta sauce, etc.

Discard with residual waste



- Polystyrene (fast-food containers, meat trays, box filling)
- Spray cans containing product, such as hairspray or deodorant
- Diapers and incontinence products
- Packaging larger than 5 litres
- Disposable cups (hard plastic or coated paper)
- Bioplastic packaging featuring a seedling logo (please note: these must not be put in the organic waste bin)
- Empty paint buckets
- Nets for oranges, limes, lemons
- Agricultural plastic, pond liner, weed barrier (large pieces to the recycling centre)
- PVC packaging
- Sealant cartridges
- Make-up
- Protective items (gloves, aprons and face masks)

Discard as SCM

(small chemical waste)



- Paint tins and buckets containing residue
- Spray cans containing hazardous substances, such as paint or pesticides
- Packaging containing chemical products (such as turpentine)
- Batteries
- Jars and blister packs containing medicines

Take to the recycling centre



- Large plastic items such as toys, garden chairs and polystyrene
- Buckets (other than packaging)

If in doubt, check the AfvalABC (All About Waste).
